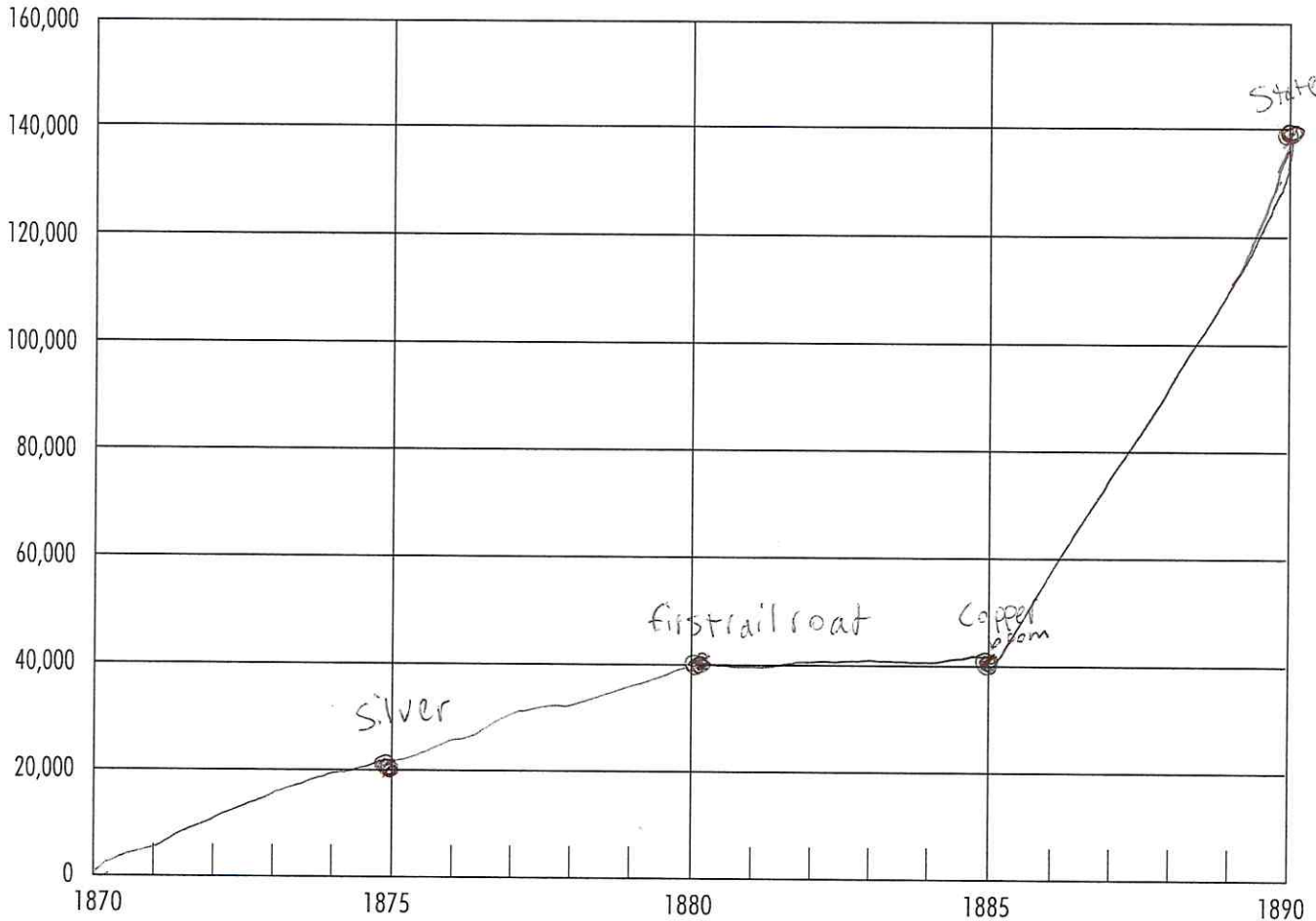


CHAPTER 6 / Creating and Interpreting a Graph
